Course Description:

Social enterprise is a rapidly growing field which utilizes an entrepreneurial approach to address social needs and create positive change. Companies such as Patagonia and Warby Parker epitomize strong and sustainable organizations which are creating both social and financial value. This course provided students with an overview of this evolving field and helped students understand how social entrepreneurs drive innovation and transformation in fields such as health, education, and the environment. Students examined the opportunities and challenges associated with a variety of types of social enterprises, including social purpose businesses, nonprofits, and revenue generating enterprises. Innovative videos and interviews provided students with a unique opportunity to engage with individuals and organizations that exemplify mission-driven values. The course included lectures, projects and presentation components leading to developing and pitching your own idea for a non-profit or for-profit social enterprise. Upon completion of this course, the student should be able to..

- · Articulate what social enterprise is and why the field has emerged and grown so rapidly in recent years.
- · Identify when an industry is ripe for innovation and understand how to assess opportunities to respond to the need.
- Demonstrate an understanding of the social entrepreneurship movement, including domestic and global opportunities and challenges for social entrepreneurs.
- Make legal structure recommendations for a spectrum of social enterprises and articulate why that particular structure (nonprofit, for profit, hybrid, benefit corporation or cooperative) is the best choice.
- Understand a variety of social enterprise business models.
- Develop a theory of change/logic model, and business model canvas.
- Identify and evaluate the social impacts of a venture.
- Talk about a range of social innovations related to social enterprise such as cooperatives, and impact investing
- Effectively collaborate in group discussions to gain a deeper understanding of social entrepreneurship theory, process, and [sep] practice. [sep]
- Create a clear and comprehensive social enterprise business plan. SEP
- Develop and deliver an effective elevator pitch
